Purpose

For many older Americans, the retirement years are spent fulfilling lifelong dreams. However many are not so fortunate. Rising numbers of frail elders living in the community have fallen victim to financial exploitation. This conference will introduce the audience to the complex dynamics of undue influence and the challenges associated with understanding this “psychology of victimization”. Elder abuse advocates must take a greater role in pursuing the integration of community systems to combat the negative impact of undue influence. Together we must seek justice, restore dignity and ensure safety to victims of elder abuse.

Page Ulrey, JD is a Senior Deputy Prosecuting Attorney at the King County Prosecutor's Office in Seattle, Washington. She graduated from Amherst College and Northeastern University School of Law.

Page was appointed to the newly-created position of elder abuse prosecutor in her office in 2001. She currently works in the Economic Crimes Unit, where she prosecutes elder financial exploitation, neglect, and sexual assault. She is the founder and co-chair of the King County Elder Abuse Council, and trains on elder abuse investigation and prosecution across the country for the Office on Violence Against Women and the National District Attorneys Association.
